### **What?**

Volunteers will help IRC staff restore the Lake Ida Parcel located at the northwest corner of Lake Ida Park in Delray Beach.

Specifically at this event, volunteers will learn to identify and remove common weedy invasive plants and help pick up trash/debris throughout the site.

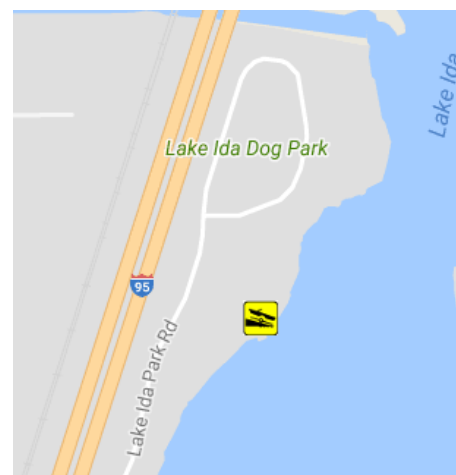


Participants are **REQUIRED** to wear closed toed shoes. Long pants and sun protection are recommended. All volunteers will receive a free t-shirt at check in.

This is the first of six volunteer days at this site. At future events, we will continue removing invasive plants and start adding native plants that will support wildlife observed on the site.

Volunteers are to meet and check in at the Lake Ida Boat Ramp (located towards the middle of Lake Ida Park). Once you are checked in, you will be taken to the site on a boat provided by the Delray Beach Fire Department.
