Recent Events



IRC participated in the 23rd annual Miami Native Plant Day. Our field biologist, Michelle Smith, promoted conservation, biodiversity and native plants while handing out native wildflower seeds to guests.



In an effort to minimize US Navy aircraft collisions with endangered species, while also providing additional nesting habitat in the face of rising sea levels, IRC completed the second nesting platform construction this past March. IRC field workers raked pearock to make a ground-level nesting platform at 1.5-2 inches deep.

The platform was constructed for the least terns (Sternula antillarum) which are Federally Endangered and Florida state-designated Threatened and for the roseate terns (Sterna dougallii) which are Federally Threatened and Florida statedesignated Threatened.



Our field biologist, Alex Blochel, led FIU students through a local pine rockland and had them pull and bag non-native plants.



Thank you to everyone who came out to the 2nd Lake Ida Parcel Volunteer Day! Volunteers helped us rake and bag invasive leaf litter to expose the underlying soil, remove invasive plants and pick up trash.

We are thrilled with the progress made so far at the site! Once again, we'd like to give a special thank you to the Delray Beach Parks & Recreation for all of their help organizing and running the events and to Bill Bathurst for being our wonderful chauffeur!
