#### IRC Receives Viva Florida Award

IRC is excited to announce that we have recently received a grant from the State of Florida and Florida Wildflower Foundation (FWF) for the Viva Florida Award Agreement in support of our Natives For Your Neighborhood (NFYN) website.

With this funding, IRC will be able to continue expanding this free resource throughout Florida, to develop additional wildlife pages, and link wildlife to plant pages and ZIP codes.

The goals with this grant are:

- To increase information sharing between the FWF website and NFYN, including direct links to FWF resources on wildflowers and pollinators. Upload images of wildflowers and wildlife shared by FWF to NFYN.
- Continue northward expansion of NFYN in Florida, including the development of wildlife and habitat lists in central Florida.
- Expand current pollinator coverage in NFYN.
- Collaborate with FWF on promoting the increase in connectivity through gardening with native plants and wildlife.
