The FISF is a free source that provides data on more than 2,500 vascular plants in the 10 southernmost counties of Florida (Martin, Glades, Charlotte counties south to the Florida Keys). <u>Check it out here!</u> The photos will also help update our other valuable resources like Natives For Your Neighborhood.
